THE HISTORY

The vision began in 1937 by Wayman Presley and Bill Lirely, who saw a need for a place where people of all denominations could gather to worship. The first Sunrise service was held atop Bald Knob Mountain on Easter Sunday of 1937, and in 1959, after much prayer and fundraising, the groundbreaking was held to construct a 111-foot steel paneled cross. Bald Knob Cross was completed in 1963, and stands today as a beacon in southern Illinois, attracting countless visitors from all over the world.
